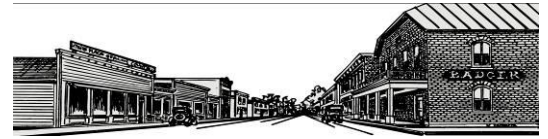
- Home garden variety pumpkins

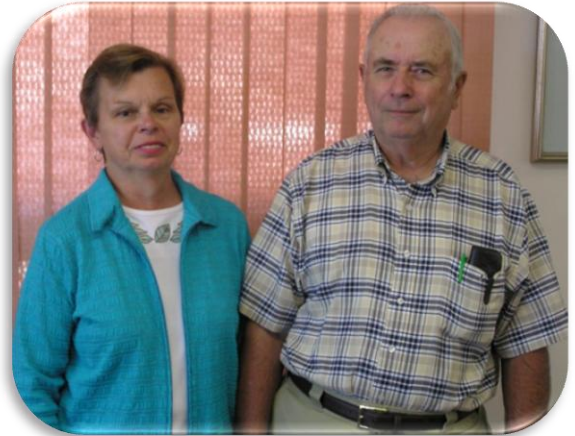


MAGIC Expresses Thanks to our Volunteers

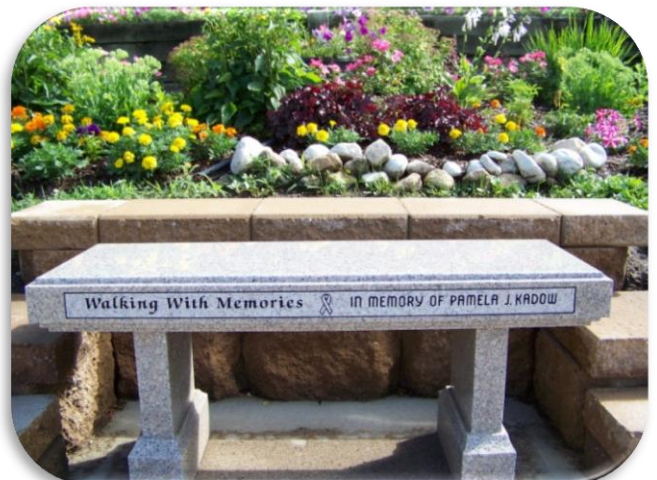

PJ's Walk for Life _____

The 1st annual Pamela Jean Kadow (PJ's) Memorial Walk for Life took place on July 24, 2011. Nearly 260 people participated in the fundraiser to benefit women with ovarian cancer. Combining registration fees and donations, the walk raised \$11,295. Funds were distributed to the National Ovarian Cancer Coalition in the amount of \$2000 and the establishment of the PJ Kadow's Cancer Patient Needs Fund at the Two Rivers Vince Lombardi Cancer Clinic. The fund is set-up to help all female cancer patients with an emphasis on ovarian cancer. Police Department News

From Chief Ryan Gilbert

Hope everyone is doing well. It has been a busy year for the police department. We have seen an increase in thefts, fraud complaints, and drug arrests. We are already approaching the number of incidents we had for a total in 2010. We have 31 animal complaints (Please keep your pets under control on a leash and prevent excessive barking.); 13 Operating a Motor Vehicle under Influence of Alcohol or Drug (two of them were drug related); 33 driving without a license (suspended, revoked or no driver's license at all.)

I would like to mention some information about fraud. We have received several calls recently of residents receiving phone calls from relatives requesting that money be wired to them. One specifically stated he was someone's grandchild. These are scams to get money, so please don't send these people money.

Another is where a person is sent a check and they are supposed to cash it and send part of it to an address and keep the rest. These checks are fraudulent and you are responsible for paying the bank back that money.

Remember: if it sounds too good to be true, it usually is.

It's that time of year when everyone wants to clean up their yards. Please remember to pick up your free burning permit at the Village Hall. Also remember Village Ordinances prohibit burning of rubber, oil, garden refuse, shrubbery, leaves and others. See ordinance 9.08 for more information.
