## **Home Delivered Meals & Dining for Seniors**

*(Contributed by Kim Loose, RDN, Nutrition Program Coordinator; Aging & Disability Resource Center of the Lakeshore)*

Manitowoc County offers a wonderful service to eligible individuals that many may not be aware of, a delicious, hot, home delivered meal. Home Delivered Meals are available anywhere in the County. In Mishicot and its surrounding areas meals can be delivered up to 5 days a week. Eligibility guidelines are as follows:

- A person aged 60 years of age or older who is frail and essentially homebound (does not leave home under normal circumstances, flexibility is allowed for appointments), or a spouse of an eligible person regardless of age or condition.
- A disabled individual who resides at home with an eligible older individual participating in the program.
- A dining site is also located at the Mishicot Vets Club where meals are served Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays to anyone 60 years of age or older and their spouse regardless of age.
- Meals are available to all qualifying individuals on a donation basis regardless of income.

## **STATE HISTORICAL MARKER UPDATE.** *STILL WAITING.....*

On January 3, 2019, another revision of our 29-page application for a historical marker was submitted to the Wisconsin Historical Society. The original application for a marker honoring the namesake for our village, township and the river was filed in October, 2017. This application has already received notable response from many, including the Hannahville Tribe, but we were told that processing an application of this kind doesn't happen overnight.

The state has already given permission for the setback on the side of cemetery hill to the east of the flowerbed. We are now waiting for permission to proceed with the project. The marker is estimated to be 5 feet wide with a height of 6 feet. Once the text is approved, it will be sent to Ohio, where it will be cast in aluminum. When it returns, it will be mounted on 2 beams 8" x 8" x 12 feet of white ash. This lumber has been donated by the Lakeshore Lumber Co. of Francis Creek. SO...Everyone....*KEEP YOUR FINGERS CROSSED.*

## Mishicot Lion's Club – Did you know????

- The Lion's Club sponsors several little free libraries throughout the community to encourage literacy for all ages in our community.

### BUILDING PERMITS

As spring approaches and your thoughts move to projects and plans for the new season, don't forget to visit village hall for a building permit. Building permits are relatively inexpensive for most projects and are required for nearly all types of building improvements, including fences.

### Elections

Only one election is in the Village of Mishicot expected this year, and it will be the Spring General Election on Tuesday, April 2. Polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Check out [www.myvote.wi.us](http://www.myvote.wi.us) to find out what is on your ballot, where your polling place is, request an absentee ballot, register to vote, update your name or address, and to check out your voter information. Note that registering to vote and updating your name or address online using MyVote can only be done more than 20 days before an election. If you need to register to vote or to update your name or address in the time period less than 20 days before an election, you may do so in the clerk's office or you may register on Election Day at the polls. Remember to bring your Photo ID every time you vote, and to bring a proof of residence if you need to register.

**SPRING – A TIME TO RENEW YOUR DOG LICENSE**



We had a great response last year with people registering their dogs in the village. I have been hearing, though, that there are still quite a few people out there who do not know this is a state law and something all dog owners need to do no matter where they live. Under Wisconsin State Law, dogs are to be licensed every year. The dog license year runs from January 1 to December 31. For dogs that live in the Village of Mishicot, all you need to do is bring the rabies vaccination certificate your vet gave you to the clerk's office at 511 E. Main Street. The licenses are \$5.00 for a dog that has been neutered or spayed; \$10 for intact males and females. We will even do licenses by mail if that is more convenient for you. Licensing your dog is also a great way to help ensure your lost dog gets home since the village uses the license reports to reunite lost dogs with their owners. It's not too late! Gail and I are here and ready to help you. Let's see if we can top last year's license totals!! If you reside outside of the Village limits, please contact your local treasurer.

**E. Church Street Construction – 2019**

Many of you may already know that E. Church Street, between S. Main and S. State Street, will be undergoing a major reconstruction project this summer/fall. Stay tuned as more details become available. We appreciate your patience and understanding as the village takes on this major project.

**Flag Fund**

Thank you to all those who have donated in the past to the village's flag fund. Anyone wishing to donate to the flag fund is asked to send or bring your donation to the village hall. Your donations will help defray the cost of replacing the village-maintained flags.

**Sand and Salt Barrels**

Some of you have asked where the sand/salt barrels are in the village. Currently, there is one at the northwest corner of the Country Store; one at the Holy Cross Catholic Church; and one at the cemetery.

**Mishicot Maintenance–Snow Removal**

Hello to all Village of Mishicot property owners. Many questions have come up regarding snow removal policies within the Village of Mishicot. The following is the village's ordinance concerning sidewalk snow removal.

**6.08 Snow and Ice Removal. (1) From Sidewalks.** The owner or occupant of any lot abutting on a public sidewalk shall clear the sidewalk of snow within 24 hours after a snowfall and keep the same free of ice. If such snow or ice is not removed as required herein the Public Works Supervisor shall cause same to be done and the cost thereof assessed against the abutting property pursuant to Section 66.60(16), Wisconsin Statutes. (12-03-96)

I would like to add that the entire width of the sidewalk should be cleared.

**(2) Deposit in Streets Prohibited.** It is unlawful for any person in clearing snow from parking lots, driveways, filling stations, garages, retail stores, apartment buildings, or other areas to pile or distribute snow, or cause snow to be piled or distributed, in a street or alley in any manner that tends to narrow the traveled portion of the street, prevent parking at the curb, or in any other way impede snow removal or create a traffic hazard. Persons having an accumulation of snow that cannot be removed as set forth in the Section shall be responsible for its handling at their own expense without depositing same in the public streets or alleyways. (12-03-96)

Also, remember that the village has a winter parking ban between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. during the months of December 1 through March 31.

## Mishicot School District News-Mishicot Enterprise

Mishicot Enterprise is a student run manufacturing business located within Mishicot High School. The purpose of the enterprise is to provide a hands on learning opportunity for students to produce, market and oversee all operations of the manufacturing and online store *mishicotenterprise.com*.

A partnership began during the second quarter of the 2017-18 school year between the Intro to Business and the Intro to Manufacturing classes. The new CTE lab was used for production and the business lab was used for defining the business plan and creating the website. Students defined the products, researched prices and promoted the products through various media as well as created the business plan.

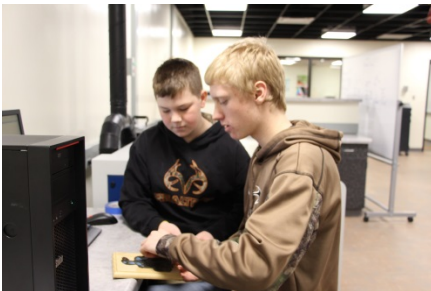
Teachers provide supervision and facilitate entrepreneurial decisions and oversee student creation of the financial reporting to the high school business office. The enterprise operation and provides students with experience in manufacturing, web design, ecommerce, accounting and marketing careers that would not occur in a traditional classroom setting.

Students use state of the art laser engraving equipment and image manipulation software to produce custom engraved plaques, RTIC tumblers, phone stands and four different types of glasses. The products are listed on a student created and run website where customers can upload an image to be laser engraved on the product. Students manage the ecommerce store by ordering and uploading new products and answering inquiries by both email and phone calls.

The products move through production to packaging and shipping. Manufacturing machine operations, image manipulation software applications and distribution procedures are taught and applied through the fulfillment of customer orders in real time. Students perform jobs such as production manager, operator, customer service technician, and shipping/receiving clerk.

The hands on entrepreneurial opportunity provides students with business experience in marketing, distribution, website management, inventory control, customer service, graphic design and accounting. They use email, documents and spreadsheets to communicate with suppliers, customers, distributors and Mishicot High School staff. This process targets district literacy goals in a real-world application where teamwork, communication and collaboration are a focus.

Local businesses have used the enterprise for engraved glasses for their coffee shops, restaurants and awards for service. Alumni from as far away as Seattle, WA have ordered products for their businesses. Within the school the RTIC tumblers are the biggest seller for students, parents, grandparents and staff.



We have many options on our online store. Most of our sales come from Tumblers and mixing glasses. I am here to day to talk to you about the two options of plaques. This two options include a Red Alder and a Walnut plaque. Both of these types of plaque come in the sizes of 5 x 7, 8 x 10, and 12 x 15.
